PARISH AND SCHOOL 1916-2016



Yes, next year the parish and school will be 100 years old! So put your thinking caps on and begin to dream. How will we celebrate who we are? What do we value especially from our rich and living tradition?

Discussions about the formation of the parish and school began towards the end of 1915 when our pastor, Fr Joseph Augustine Canali died after falling from a tram (15 August). The first parish priest, Fr Arthur O'Keefe was appointed at the beginning of 1916 and, with the arrival of the first Sisters of the

Good Samaritan, the school also opened at this time. (We note that 2016 is also the centenary of Lourdes Hill College).

Church and school will work together – it is the centenary of the entire parish community of Sts Peter and Paul. So we will need to form a joint planning committee.

We will need to celebrate together. The school P&F is talking about holding a Centenary Ball. Will we also have a special parish dinner? The school Fete will be on next year. What other events should we consider? How can we include those who have had a connection with the parish in the past?

Do we need to erect some kind of monument to mark the centenary? What should it be? We should surely prepare a booklet on our parish history. What would it include? Anyone who has historical photos or mementos of our 100 years might like to make them available for the parish archives.

Are there liturgical celebrations we should consider? The feast day of Sts Peter and Paul on 29 June is an obvious occasion.

Social, historical, liturgical... what else should we consider? Have any of you been involved with centenaries before? Share your good ideas. Send an email or note to the parish office. THANK YOU.
