## Second Sunday of Easter

### *Jesus often surprises, but never disappoints*

This is one of the famous phrases of our Archbishop, Mark Coleridge, whom we welcome to Sts Peter and Paul this weekend for pastoral visitation. He will celebrate Confirmation and first Communion at our three Sunday Masses and will meet with parishioners on Sunday morning between 10am and 12 noon. He will visit the school on Monday morning.

The archbishop was born and educated in Melbourne in 1948 but received some of his primary education in Adelaide. After finishing high school, he earned an Arts degree from Melbourne University majoring in English and French. Then, after six years in the seminary, he was ordained in Melbourne's St Patrick's cathedral on 18 May 1974. After only a few years in parish ministry, he spent four years studying Scripture at the Pontifical Biblical Institute in Rome and Jerusalem. He taught in Melbourne for three years before returning to Rome to complete his Doctorate. Archbishop Mark then taught Scripture again, eventually becoming Master of Melbourne's Catholic Theological College.

In 1997, he was invited to work in the English-language division of the Vatican at the Secretariat of State. Five years later, he was ordained bishop and became an auxiliary bishop in Melbourne. In 2006, he was appointed Archbishop of Canberra-Goulburn and, in 2012, the seventh Archbishop of Brisbane.

He has been very involved with the new translation of the Roman Missal, chairing the editorial committee of the International Commission on the Liturgy and has also been chairing the International Commission for the Preparation of an English-language Lectionary. He has been a member of two Pontifical Councils, for Culture and Social Communications.

Archbishop Coleridge is a distinguished leader in the Australian Church. He has been a priest for 40 years and a bishop for 12. He is a well-known Scripture scholar and a wise teacher. We look forward to his pastoral guidance this weekend as he celebrates the Eucharist with us and preaches the Word of God.

The archbishop's visitation of the diocese is mandated by the Code of Canon Law but its purpose is pastoral. He comes to strengthen our faith and life in the Spirit and to encourage our ministry and mission. Through a pastoral dialogue, we will grow in mutual understanding and will be able to work together more fruitfully for the mission of Christ in the world. Pope Francis spoke of pastors knowing the smell of the sheep! We hope Archbishop Coleridge will catch a whiff of the fragrant aroma of the many generous works of service undertaken in the parish of Sts Peter and Paul.

Ever the maker and keeper of my days.


You know my resting and my rising.
