Parish Survey 2020: at a glance

The following article is a report to parishioners of Sts Peter and Paul by the Parish Pastoral Council highlighting key points that arose from the over 120 responses to the recent parish survey.

In June 2020, the Parish Council of Sts Peter and Paul surveyed parishioners on the future hopes and directions of our parish. This survey was conducted during a period of significant change for the parish, including the retirement of Father Tom Elich, commencement of Father Kevin Smith and conclusion of Sister Ann-Maree Nicholls's term as school principal. In addition, restrictions brought about by the COVID-19 pandemic changed the way we interact as a parish.

There was an encouragingly strong response to the parish survey. The Parish Council was particularly impressed with the richness of the feedback and the genuine desire of parishioners to contribute ideas. Some key themes emerged from the survey:

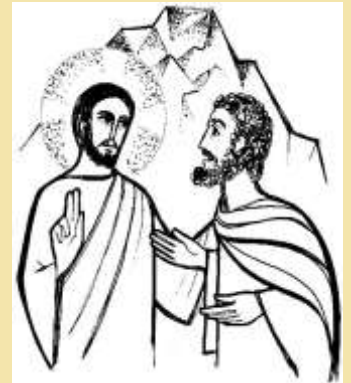
- There was overwhelming support for the way in which the parish has communicated with parishioners during the period of lockdown and the gradual easing of restrictions.
- Parishioners appreciate receiving the weekly emails (containing parish newsletter, Sunday readings, family prayer) and would like this to continue even after restrictions ease.
- There is a strong sense of community spirit in liturgy, social activities and volunteer ministries, underpinned with a feeling that this really is a faith community.
- There is a desire for greater visibility and transparency of parish governance.
- A desire for greater youth engagement was evident, with suggestions for more child and youth-based activities in order to provide more connection with young members of the parish.
- The significant contribution of Father Tom Elich to parish life was acknowledged, with a recognition of the opportunities a new parish priest brings.
- Many parishioners expressed a desire to participate actively in the parish and would like to know more about activities in which they can be involved.

These, along with the many other suggestions that have not been summarised above, will form the basis of a Parish Council planning meeting that will be held in September 2020. With your support and prayers, the Parish Council hopes to continue building a parish community that is welcoming, engaging and a source of spiritual nourishment in our changing world. Thank you all for the generosity of your feedback.

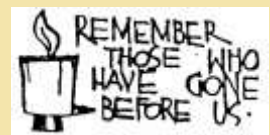

- All Catholics are still dispensed from their Sunday obligation.

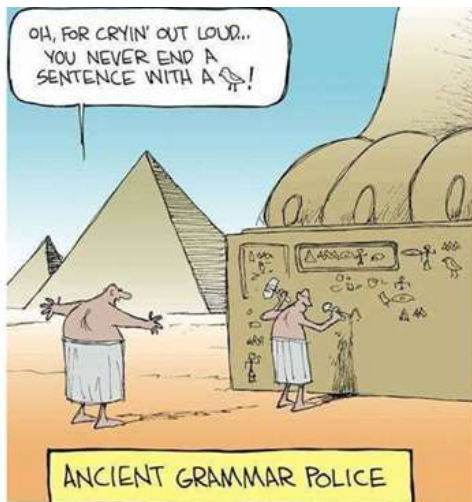
Please continue to use the Sunday Readings and Family Prayer with your family at home. Read the texts aloud, talk about them and pray together.
