# The Transfiguration of t<mark>he Lord</mark>

This Sunday, the 6th August, is the Feast of the Transfiguration of the Lord. Jesus, in the presence of some disciples reveals his full identity as Son of God by means of bright and glorious light. The disciples came to see Jesus as God sees Him and the Word of God today helps us to do the same.

Since 6th August 1945 the world saw another powerful light and cloud unleashed upon the world. The dropping of the atomic bomb on Hiroshima and another on Nagasaki three days later may have ended one war but it unleashed a terrible threat to the world that still exists today. The light of God shining out of the transfigured Jesus on the 6th August and a very different light and cloud shining over us at the dawn of the Atomic age.

Where do we now see God's light in our lives full of sorrows and joys as they are? How can we hear Jesus and experience his divine light in a world of lights of quite a different kind? We are given a new commandment by God on the mountain; that we are to listen to and follow God's Beloved Son. How do we do this today in a world filled with so many distractions and attractions? Our faith compels us to transform the world by letting our faces and lives shine with the love of the risen Lord. The Gospel to day proclaims that those who truly listen can also encounter the risen Christ transfigured. Can we stick to our convictions and consciences when faced with the cross as Jesus himself did and we are called to do? We pray that God will help us to listen to the voice of God's beloved Son, so that one day we may merit to be co-heirs with him.

On Tuesday 8th August is the Feast of Mary MacKillop, our first Australian saint and a light for many people in her life time and continues to be so. Mass will be held at 9.00am and some children from the school will be ministering during the Mass. The following Tuesday, 15th August, is the Feast of the Assumption of Mary and Mass will be at 9:00am.




