Today's Gospel from John takes us back to last week's Gospel from Mark where we were introduced to John the Baptist. Once again, we find ourselves at the beginning of a Gospel. Unlike Mark's straightforward telling of the Baptist's ministry, this Gospel, written much later than Mark, presents the Baptist somewhat more mysteriously. He is one who came "to testify to the light." He does prepare for one much greater than himself who while not named is Jesus.

In the joy and excitement of these days of celebration we never forget to make room for those who experience this time of year especially full of grief. Those who live alone, those who are estranged from family and those who have lost a loved one. We are very aware of those places in the world who are face terrible suffering due to war and conflict. The light to which John the Baptist refers is a gift to all people and we pray that the darkness which can overwhelm people will be eased by the light who is Jesus Christ.

Don't forget the Carols Night at the Good Samaritan Hall on Tuesday evening the 19th. There is a sausage sizzle available from 5:30pm and the Carols commence at 6:30pm. During the Carols children will lead us in the Nativity Story.

On Wednesday the 20th at 7:00pm there is a Mass for Reconciliation. For many people this is a significant way to prepare spiritually for the Christmas season by acknowledging our need for God's mercy and, with God's help, bring the Good News born among us to others.

The Sunday will therefore be celebrated on the evening of Saturday 23 and the morning of Sunday 24, followed by Christmas on the evening of Sunday 24 and the morning of Monday 25.
