# First Sunday of <del>Advent</del>

The word advent means to arrive and it usually refers to the arrival of something or someone significant. For example, "how did we possibly keep in touch before the advent of the mobile phone?" The first season of the Church's year, which commences today, is known as Advent and refers to the arrival of Christ. It is very important to realise that Christians believe that Christ, who was born among us, died, and rose from the dead will return again. The Word of God during the first weeks of Advent reflect on this aspect of our faith. In the beautiful readings from the prophet Isaiah, we hear again that the longings of the human heart hold the desire to be with the one who created us. Despite the darkness, evil and lies that surround us, that for which we deeply long will arrive. It cannot be just ourselves and our wants who fill those longings because it will never be enough and cannot satisfy. The path we tread as followers of Jesus gives meaning to our life and to every life and when we meet Jesus in glory every hope in our hearts will be fulfilled. This aspect of Advent helps prepare us for everyday that lies ahead.

The last week of Advent invites us to remember and prepare for the first arrival of Christ as the Word of God made flesh and when he was born in the humblest of circumstances in Bethlehem. This aspect of Advent prepares us for Christmas day and the feasts of the Christmas season. This year with Christmas Day being Monday, the fourth week of Advent is only a few hours long. The Masses on Sunday afternoon and evening of the 24<sup>th</sup> December are Masses of Christmas Eve.

Amidst the excitement, and quicker pace of these days let's not lose sight of what we celebrate and for whose arrival we prepare. And yet you Lord are our Father. We the clay you the potter, we are all the work of your hand. (Isaiah 64:8.)
