Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Trust is not easy to define in the abstract but we know it when we see and experience it. We also know that we must take the leap before trust is experienced. Today's readings invite us to take the leap and trust in the Lord who gives life. The first reading consists of a collection of wisdom sayings centred on the importance of trusting in God and the foolishness of placing ourselves as the control centre of all that is possible. The imagery of a tree with deep roots is frequently used to describe those who trust in God, because even in times of trouble they will survive.

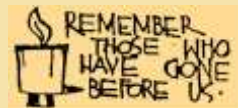
In the Gospel we encounter Jesus and a large crowd of Jews and non-Jews gathered on a plain in Galilee to hear him speak. He goes on to deliver the beatitudes, as recorded by Luke, which are in fact about trusting in God who will always care for those who suffer in any way. Jesus includes a matching set of woes that focus on those who have turned away from God by refusing to do their part in alleviating those same sufferings. Where do we stand?

As we know the First Reading each week is chosen in light of the Gospel for that week and shows how Jesus is the fulfilment of the Prophets and Law of the Old Testament. The Second Reading is usually a semi continuous reading of one of Paul's Letters or one of the other epistles. This week we continue from Paul's first letter to the Corinthians where Paul is teaching us about the bodily resurrection. We believe Christ is risen from the dead otherwise everything else is in vain and meaningless. Paul then states that with Jesus all who trust in his name will be raised to new life with him.

CHANGES TO ATTENDING SUNDAY MASS – COVID RESTRICTIONS AND REQUIREMENTS. Requirements to collect contact information using the Check in QLD app are changing. At venues where unvaccinated people are permitted to attend, ie churches, the parish will no longer need to collect contact information from attendees via the Check in app. Masks remain mandatory when indoors. Priests and readers may remove their masks while at the ambo where there is a need to communicate more clearly. We ask you to PLEASE continue with routine precautions minimising the risk of transmission -

- *Maintain social distancing where possible (1.5m) particularly when queuing for Holy Communion and when entering and exiting the Church.*

MUSIC FOR OUR PARISH LITURGY – Part 1

This is the first of three instalments on music in our parish. This week, we will consider briefly how and why music is chosen. Music for liturgy doesn't happen randomly; it is selected carefully according to three judgements: **1. Liturgical:** appropriateness of the text and relationship to the particular liturgical rite; **2. Pastoral:** appropriateness to this particular community; assisting them in their faith formation and development; **3. Musical:** technically, aesthetically and expressively worthy for the liturgy. So, each time we sing together in the liturgy, let us be aware of these three factors. In fact, let us be aware that music can do what words alone cannot but that the main role of music in the liturgy is to help us all join 'with the action of Christ and to give voice to the gift of faith.'
