Second Sunday

Every year on the second Sunday of Lent we hear the story of the Transfiguration of Jesus. In this year of Mark we hear his version. The first one to be recorded. What comes before and after this event are very important. Peter has just affirmed Jesus as the long awaited promised one, the Anointed of God or Christ, the Messiah. Jesus praises Peter for this insight and the act of faith that affirms it. The transfiguration of Jesus in the company of Moses and Elijah confirms Peters insight. Moses and Elijah give witness to the promise God has renewed for generations through the Law (Moses) and the Prophets (Elijah) that the promise would indeed be kept. The voice from heaven should dispel any remaining doubt or confusion in the minds of those present or for us today. While still in the "after glow" of what happened on the mountain Jesus gives the first prediction of his impending suffering and death. This person of great glory and power will suffer for and with us. The passion of Jesus does not diminish in any way the glory of the Transfiguration. In fact, Jesus' death shows the extent to which he is prepared to live the promise of God. "I will be your God and you will be my people." This death will be one very important aspect of the true glory of Jesus and it should be the same for all who live in him.



Longing for light, we wait in darkness. Longing for truth, we turn to you. Make us your own, your holy people. Light for the world to see.


Christ, be our light! Shine in our hearts. Shine through the darkness. Christ, be our light! Shine in your church gathered today.


