First Sunday of <mark>Lent</mark>

The origins behind the purpose of Lent lie in the journey of conversion of those who wished to become Christian. Initially this journey was a very long process that could take years. It reached its highpoint with the celebration of the Sacraments which only took place at the Easter vigil, the holy night of the Lord's resurrection. The time immediately before this celebration had a particular concentration of prayer by the catechumens and the faith community. Once again we can be grateful to Vatican Council II and the liturgical movement of the time for the renewed appreciation of the ancient wisdom. On Sunday afternoon, the first Sunday of Lent, our four catechumens will gather with their sponsors and all catechumens from throughout the Archdiocese at the Cathedral of St Stephen for the celebration of the Rite of Election. The Archbishop will acknowledge their readiness for the Sacraments and their names will be recorded as they are enrolled for the Easter celebrations. They will no longer be called catechumens but rather the Elect. (Similarly, we refer to the Prime Minister "elect" after the election result until being officially installed by the Governor General.)

This Rite of Election is one of several rites or ceremonies that will take place during Lent. (It's where the R in RCIA comes from.) Please be aware that these occur for the sake of both the elect and the parish community. They call all of us to prayer, to deepen our christian life and to support those who will join the community at Easter. Please keep James Rebecca, Bronwyn and Chris in your prayers.

All are invited to morning tea at 9.00am om Sunday to farewell Gerry Crooks. Gerry no longer resides in the parish and his commitments also mean he will no longer be involved in the music ministry. Gerry has served this community very generously in organising musicians, the selection of music and often leading the music at several Masses on one weekend. We will miss his talents and generosity. Please come along to the morning Tea as we express our sincere thanks and wish Gerry well.

From the dawning of creation, you have loved us as your own; Stay with us through all temptation, make us turn to you alone.


