150th Anniversary Message Stick

This weekend the Brisbane East Deanery receives the message stick as part of the invitation to the 150 year celebrations of the Cathedral of St Stephen. It will be displayed in Sts Peter and Paul's this weekend before it makes its way to other parishes in the Deanery.

The Message Stick, an ancient and culturally significant instrument of welcome and acceptance, is travelling around the Archdiocese of Brisbane. This journey is designed to herald the 150th Anniversary of the completion and opening of the Cathedral of St Stephen on the sacred lands of the First Nations Peoples of Meanjin Brisbane. The Message Stick holds an invitation for parishioners across the Archdiocese to come together on Pentecost Sunday at the Cathedral to celebrate this momentous occasion.

Prayer for the Sesquicentenary of the Cathedral of St Stephen

L: Down by the river, heavenly Father, on this earth our mother, where children of the Dreaming long made a home before us, our forebears in faith have built this mother church of St Stephen, a family home for you and us.

ALL: Stone by stone and prayer by prayer they have raised this holy house, familiar forms on foreign land, a place where Brisbane could know Christ's sacrifice and feast, where you could speak and we could listen, where the tide of your mercy could flow.

L: Here saints and sinners have come, bringing their young and their dead, all their hopes and their dreams. Through times of sorrow and joy the stones have spoken of Easter, of a life that is bigger than death, of a love that has the last word. Through one hundred and fifty years, we have made the building and the building has made us, a temple of living stones.

ALL: Now we tell the story of your grace, thankful as we remember. By that same unfailing grace may this cathedral never cease to be a home for all at the heart of the city and a house for you, God-with-us, on this earth down by the river. Through Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen*.

This week's goal: Ecological Spirituality

This week's goal refers to the spiritual connection between human beings and the planet earth. This helps us to 'discover God in all things'. Consider blessing a natural space as a reflection or meditation area and regularly pray outdoors.

ASH WEDNESDAY is the first day of the season of Lent. It is designated by the Church as a day of fasting and abstinence, as is Good Friday. In current Catholic practice, fasting means having only one full meal a day. Smaller quantities of food may be eaten at two other meals. The law of fasting applies to people from 18 to 59 years old. Abstinence is the practice of abstaining from the use of certain kinds of food. Everyone aged 14 years and older usually abstains from meat. The practice of fasting and abstinence aims at leading us to interior conversion by making us more disciplined and more charitable. We fast in order to share our time and our treasure with an attitude of love towards God and others. In addition, the practice helps us imitate the example of Jesus who fasted for forty days in the desert. The ashes that are marked on our foreheads on the first day of Lent are a symbol of humility, purification and sorrow and remind us of the need to repent.
