# The Baptism of the Lord

Jesus grew up in the backwater town of Nazareth in Galilee. When news reached him that John was baptising in the Jordan river near Jericho, he seems to have interpreted it as a sign that the time had come for his public ministry to begin. When Jesus came up from the water, the heavens opened suddenly and Mark records that the Spirit descended like a dove upon him. And a voice from heaven was heard saying "You are my Son, the beloved; my favour rests on you". We learn that Jesus is sent by God and the "Beloved" of God.

As Jesus begins his public ministry we are granted a revelation, a manifestation or epiphany, of the Holy Trinity. The union of Father, Son and Spirit is participating in this baptism ritual. However, we see something else as well. We see Jesus accepting baptism by John, mingling with those who have come to confess their sins, be baptised and receive forgiveness. Jesus joins the queue of people for baptism wanting to share the joys and sorrows of his people. Jesus shows that he intends to engage with humanity in all of its struggles, limitations and problems.

The baptism of Jesus begins his plunge into the life of the people in a new and very public way. In the depths of the water he enters into the depths of his own humanity, human society and the natural world which is the context of life for us all. We could say that Jesus has entered into that part of all of us which laughs and sings, dances and cries, feels for those who are sick and suffering, desires the best for others and cares for God's creation. Baptism builds up the faith, not only of the person being baptised, but of the entire church community.

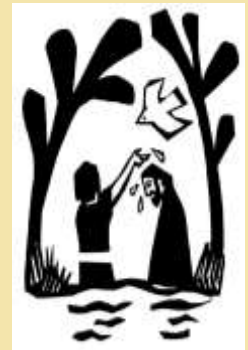
Today we are reminded of the implications of our baptism in Christ. It both calls and enables us to live as Christ did and immerse ourselves in the grief and joy of God's people. We are called to show compassion to people in need, be advocates for justice and peace in the name of the poor, and care for the gifts of the earth. The instinctive need to love and be loved is lived fruitfully if we return to the life and power of baptism.

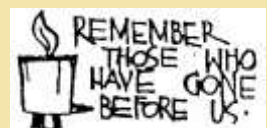

**BAPTISM PREPARATION** - One of the most rewarding experiences of being a Catholic is to witness the baptism of a child into our Christian community. There is something very special about this ritual – the water, the candle, the holy oil, the white garment, the gathering around of family and godparents. This is very much a hope-filled event when a child begins the initiation process of growing into the fullness of life as part of the Christian community. As such, the preparation for a child’s baptism is very important. Parents and godparents not only need to understand the commitment they are making on behalf of their child, but they also need to understand the ritual itself as well as its significance in the on-going faith development of the child. This time of preparation is very much appreciated by parents who perhaps are renewing their own faith life. For those who help them prepare, this is also a very rewarding moment of grace. For some years now, we have been blest with volunteers who are involved in this ministry of baptism preparation for an hour on a Sunday morning after Mass. However, from the start of this year, we are introducing a slightly new process with some new content. All the materials and information for the Sessions is provided (with much of the very user friendly content) coming from the Archdiocese. As with all important ministries we are providing the opportunity now for ministers to either renew their commitment or take a well-earned break, as well as providing the opportunity for new people to join this important and worthwhile ministry. We are now seeking volunteers (those who have volunteered in the past together with new volunteers) for this ministry who would like to be part of our parish’s Baptism Preparation Team. Each person would be part of a team that delivers the preparation session – in other words, you would be working with 2-3 others at any one session. The time commitment would be minimal (once a quarter, depending on the size and make-up of the team).

Prior to the new system starting, there will be an information meeting for the group to acquaint members with what is required. This will be held on **MONDAY 18 JANUARY AT 5.30PM.**

**PETITION TO STATE PARLIAMENT – THE ‘CARE FIRST’ APPROACH WORKS BEST.**

As you may be aware, Voluntary Assisted Dying (VAD) legislation will come before parliament in mid-2021. This is a complex life ethics issue and requires action from those who support palliative care and accompanying the sick and vulnerable as the more compassionate way of caring for the terminally ill. There are still options for those who are opposed to euthanasia/assisted suicide and adding your voice to the following petition is one of them. Although this is a secular based petition, please note it is perfectly in harmony with the Catholic position on VAD, in that:

- We support better funding of palliative care instead of legislating VAD
- Faced with a new parliament hosting many first time members, it’s wise to follow due legislative process and allow a proper parliamentary committee scrutiny of the new draft legislation
