Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Doing God's will may bring a sense of purpose but it is not easy. Especially when it involves challenging people who have become complacent in their faith or who feel they are beyond reproach. Jeremiah is an excellent example of a prophet with a difficult assignment. Jeremiah had to announce to a people who considered themselves indestructible, that defeat was near at hand. This was fulfilled in the exile into Babylon, more or less an eviction from the Promised Land. Despite the threats of death, Jeremiah is encouraged to remain faithful and steadfast despite the pressure he endures.

In this the prophet is a Christ figure who himself will also face hostile opposition to his message. We hear today that while Jesus claims to fulfil in both word and action the prophecy of Isaiah, which we heard last week, people presume to know this carpenter's son and so they reject him. God's ways and desires for us can be difficult to hear for all of us. The beloved Pope Francis is much loved until he proclaims a message or challenge that is a little too close to home or one with which we just disagree. Criticism of Pope Francis soon follows and apparently his love, compassion, common sense and prophetic vision has eluded him. Is it what he says or our filters that need attention?

ATTENDING SUNDAY MASS – COVID RESTRICTIONS AND REQUIREMENTS. The 'Check in QLD app' is mandatory for everyone attending Places of Worship. Please check in via the app. Scan the QR code shown on the flyers at the church doors. Once this is completed, please show this to the marshal on the door. *For those who do not have a smart phone, please check in with the Marshal at Mass or ask someone to check you in on their phone as a guest. Everyone is welcome to attend a Mass or liturgy regardless of their vaccination status.* Places of Worship are not subject to vaccination restrictions. Please be aware that it is now a requirement of Queensland Health that masks are worn in all indoor settings. We ask you to PLEASE continue with routine precautions minimising the risk of transmission of COVID-19 including:

- **Stay home when you are sick**
- **Maintain social distancing where possible (1.5m) particularly when queuing for Holy Communion and when entering and exiting the Church.**
