Feast of the Epiphany of the Lord

History books are full of epic journeys of discovery, some of them westward-leading like the one we celebrate today. Geography studies in the 1970s included detailed timelines and maps of Europeans making their way from Sydney Cove on the east coast over the Blue Mountains and into vast "unknown" territory. The presumption of a vast inland sea occupied the expertise of many explorers. Listening to and cooperating with Australia's first peoples may have saved many lives in the forlorn attempt.

The journey of the magi was perhaps just as dangerous. They travelled in unknown territory and they were not Jews but strangers in the land. While they did ride camels the influence of Herod nearly included them in a murderous trap. All that guided these three was their search for a great king of ancient prophecy whose star they had seen rising in the east. Whatever their expectations the star guided them away from Jerusalem and shone over a humble dwelling. There they found a young mother and her baby. Entering with awe, they realised that this lowly place was where God had come to dwell with humankind. More than a Jewish king, Jesus was destined to rule the hearts of all people of good will.

These visitors give us some insight of what it means to live by faith. Committed and persevering, poring over ancient scriptures, theirs was a lifelong quest for meaning. They were courageous too, setting out without knowing the destination. It was the kind of faith that lets go of expectations. They went looking for a king, but did not go away disappointed when they were led to one who was at home with the poorest of people. Before this gracious child they fell to their knees in wonder. They offered him their all.

For all of us who share the ancient longing for someone who can truly lead us, our spiritual path may not be so different from that of those three. We too may encounter a "Herod" or two who deceive us with false promises. We too may feel mysteriously guided, though as the wise men discovered, stars have a habit of disappearing, leaving us nevertheless to go forward in faith. But of this we can be sure: however winding the road, however long we take to get to our Bethlehem, Jesus and his mother will be waiting for us.

EPIPHANY - The English word ‘epiphany’ derives from the Greek term *epiphaneia*, which means ‘to appear’, ‘to be made manifest’. Originally, it referred to insight gained through experience with the divine. Today, we use the (non-capitalised) word ‘epiphany’ variously to refer to a sudden manifestation or perception regarding the essential nature or meaning of something, a ‘light-bulb’ moment involving a realisation or discovery, perhaps even a revelatory circumstance or event.

In Christian tradition, Epiphany (with a capital E), deriving from the same Greek word, refers principally to the manifestation of Jesus Christ to the Gentiles as represented by the wise men from the East (astrologers or ‘magi’) in the Gospel story (interestingly, there is no mention in the Gospel of how many ‘wise men’ came – the assumption of ‘three’ is probably made because of the three ‘gifts’ of gold, frankincense and myrrh). Traditionally, Epiphany is celebrated twelve days after Christmas on January 6 (or the Sunday closest to this day, as occurs this year) by Catholic and most other Christian churches. Eastern Orthodox churches celebrate it on January 19, since they commemorate Christmas Eve on January 6.

As an aside: in earlier times in England and other countries, the night before Epiphany (that is, the twelfth night) was often marked with considerable eating and drinking – even more so than the twelve days previous – to signify the end of the Christmas season. Indeed, Shakespeare wrote his romantic comedy *Twelfth Night or What You Will* as an entertainment for such a night. And a cautionary word: in some countries, superstition holds that it is unlucky to leave Christmas decorations hanging after the twelfth night!

A sense of humour is a gift from God. Laughter unites us.
