Eleventh Sunday in Ordinary Time

World Refugee Day (June 20th)

is celebrated in many countries in order to create a better understanding between different communities and to encourage successful integration, enabling refugees to live in safety and to contribute to the social and cultural life of their adopted countries. It often provides a unique opportunity for us all to experience and celebrate the rich diversity of refugee communities through food, theatre, music, dance, film and other events which take place all over Australia.

The United Nations High Commission for Refugees today says there is a worldwide total of 50 million refugees, refugee claimants and people displaced within their own country's borders. Like them, Jesus and his family knew well what it meant to flee from danger and live as strangers in Egypt for many years.

On 8th July 2013 Pope Francis said: ***"We have lost the sense of fraternal responsibility; we have fallen into the hypocritical attitude of the priest and of the servant of the altar that Jesus speaks about in the parable of the Good Samaritan: We look upon the brother half dead by the roadside, perhaps we think "poor guy" and we continue on our way, it's none of our business; and we feel fine with this. We feel at peace with this. The culture of well-being, that makes us think of ourselves, that makes us live in soap bubbles, that are beautiful but are nothing, are illusions of futility, of the transient, that brings us to others, that brings even the globalisation of indifference. In this world of globalisation we have fallen into a globalisation of indifference. Accustomed to the suffering of others, it doesn't concern us, it's none of our business"***

These are tough words! Are we really like that? It could be that the problems of those people are seemingly insurmountable and it is difficult to know what we can do to help them. What could we do? A few suggestions -

A Novena of Prayer:

The Catholic Justice & Peace Commission of the Archdiocese of Brisbane has prepared a "Novena of Prayer" from 12/6 to 20/6 (World Refugee Day). The novena seeks to rekindle a spirit of tender mercy and loving compassion for all those who flee persecution and violence in our world.

The Romero Centre is a Catholic Agency, conducted by the Sisters of Mercy and volunteers in Brisbane. They are working daily with refugees and asylum seekers who live in our midst. They have suggested that a practical way of assisting them is with donations to the Centre of cash, topped-up Go- cards, gift cards for Coles, K Mart or Woolworths. These will be given to refugees who are being cared for by the Centre.
