Eleventh Sunday in Or<mark>dinary Time</mark>

"The Lord is good: His kindness endures forever, and his faithfulness to all generations." These words which we pray in the Psalm this weekend was like a mini creed in Jesus' day. They were a small prayer or act of faith which acknowledged that although disasters had happened to Israel, even those that were self-inflicted, they had recovered when they renewed their faith in God.

The primary example was the Exodus from Egypt, the setting of this Sunday's first reading. In earlier times the Israelites had taken refuge in Egypt but over the years they had been reduced to slavery. God did not forget His promise to bring them to freedom and security.

In Jesus' day the people of Israel were confronted with yet more disaster. The conquering Romans and their harsh economic policies made worse and more severe the conditions of poverty, illness, malnutrition, crime, fear and untimely death. Yet it was the most vulnerable who became Jesus' most cherished possession. Others were sent by Jesus to continue this kindness of God in our midst and spread the Good News.

We are confronted time and time again with unforeseen disasters and tragedies which bring sadness to loved ones that most can only imagine. Speeches are made in Parliament and community services and rituals are held. These are important but we seem very tentative as a society to speak words of hope at such times. We recognise only pain, sorrow, and loss. Are we so fearful of offending that we dare not refer to basic christian hope, which comes from God's kindness. It would seem that only the past is worthwhile, and it is all that we are left with. A very basic christian belief is that we have a future because God's kindness endures forever and His faithfulness to all generations.






