Third Sunday of <mark>Lent</mark>

While all four Gospels record the event of Jesus removing the money changers from the temple John, whom we will hear from this week, places it at the beginning of his Gospel. The money changers had a very practical role. The temple tax had to be paid by worshippers and the Roman coin, which bore the head of the emperor who claimed to be a God, was unacceptable as payment. The local coinage had to be provided and these merchants greatly overcharged the 'captive market' in the temple forecourts. The first three Gospels place this event at the end of the ministry of Jesus and it is used to justify the arrest of Jesus. By the time John's Gospel is written clear differences are emerging between Christian beliefs and those of our Jewish forbears. The death and resurrection of Jesus has made all the difference. When asked what sign he can offer to justify his behaviour in the temple Jesus says it will be his death and rising from the dead. In John's Gospel this is his central message and believing this is to truly be alive. There is no longer any need to offer animal sacrifice to God in the temple because Jesus is the new and everlasting Temple and to live with and in him is to offer all that is necessary to God.

Hopefully the days and weeks of Lent enable us to grow in our faith and especially our knowledge of Jesus and his love for us. How can we 'live in him' and be more aware of the love he has shown us? Am I grateful for the blessings received or do I take for granted who and what is truly a gift in my life? If a few tables are 'turned over' for me during these days, it may well be the grace of God very powerfully at work.
