# Third Sunday of <u>Gent</u>

#### An Invitation

On 7th February last we celebrated Word of God Sunday. This Feast Day, instituted only two years ago by Pope Francis, has the purpose of reminding all the faithful of the precious gift that are the Scriptures and the importance for all of us to ponder the Bible as God speaking to us and for us to learn from actively listening.

For most Catholics our regular encounter with God's Word occurs at Mass so this opportunity should not be taken for granted but instead must be taken seriously, reverently and the readings proclaimed and listened to with faith.

The following are extracts from the General Instruction of the Roman Missal or GIRM. This very important document is the guide and explanation of the Roman Missal which is the large red book which holds the prayers that we, the Church, pray at Mass.

In the Mass is spread the table both of God's Word and of the Body of Christ and from it the faithful are to be nourished and refreshed. (GIRM 28)

When the Sacred Scriptures are read in the Church, God speaks to his people, and Christ, present in his word, proclaims the Gospel. Therefore, the readings from the Word of God are to be listened to reverently by everyone, for they are the element of the greatest importance in the Liturgy. (GIRM 29)

The function of proclaiming the readings is by tradition, not presidential but ministerial. Therefore, the readings are to be read by a reader, but the Gospel by the Deacon or a Priest. After each reading the acclamation is pronounced and by means of the reply the assembled people give honour to the Word of God that they have received in faith and with gratitude. (GIRM 59)

These few extracts give us an indication of the true significance of God's Word as fundamental to our worship as well as providing a guide as to how they are proclaimed.

Stating that the function of proclaiming is ministerial not presidential is simply expressing that a minister, not the presider (the priest) proclaims the readings. Our praise and worship of God as God's own people is less an expression of who we truly are if ministers do not carry out the ministry assigned to them of proclaiming the Word of God at Mass.

This *Monday* and *Wednesday* there will be a Readers workshop for those continuing and those new to this important ministry. I would particularly ask you to seriously consider the invitation to become a Reader if you have not done so before. This ministry now rests with only a few people who generously minister to us. I hope that by more people making themselves available the ministry can be rostered on a monthly basis.

The workshop will be held in the church on Monday 8 March at 7pm and repeated on Wednesday 10 March at 10am. I look forward to seeing current Readers and new Readers there.

#### GOOD SAMARITAN EARLY CHILDHOOD CENTRE -Abaokoro, Republic of Kiribati

An Update from Sr Meg Kahler SJS, Member of Council, Good Samaritan Congregation Centre, Sydney. February 2021

After a brief break over the Christmas season, a new building company has resumed work on the Good Samaritan Early Childhood Centre. They are moving very quickly to complete the toilet block and the finishing details of the classroom area for the centre. After the delay to the start of the school year throughout Kiribati, resuming on February 15th, the Early Childhood Centre commenced with 24 eager students - Sr Tibwau has said that others are coming! With the work being well underway, the new builders are hopeful of finishing the building works by the end of March, 2021. COVID has not reached Kiribati. The country has had its borders closed since late February 2020 with only government-coordinated flights from Fiji being permitted. The focus has been on the repatriation of Kiribati citizens who have been stranded in Fiji. A building formerly used for teachers' accommodation was converted to serve as a quarantine 'hotel'. Our two Kiribati sisters who were professed in 2020 are still with us in Australia - I know they are very much looking forward to returning home – it could be quite some time yet!
