Sixth Sunday of Easter

In light of today's tensions and conflicts that occur in the church, it is tempting to think that early Christian life was far more peaceful. In fact, Jesus disciples faced differences and conflict from the beginning.

Today's reading from Acts immediately follows that of last Sunday which described Paul and his co-workers rejoicing that God had opened the door of faith to the Gentiles. But some Judean Christians insisted that Gentile Christians (that's you and me) must follow all Jewish religious practices, including circumcision. Debates ensued between Paul and the disciples in Jerusalem, resulting in the decision that only some Jewish practices need be followed.

The most important aspect of this decision is its source: "The Holy Spirit and ... us". There was no doubt in the faith of the early Christian community that Christ crucified and risen, continued to guide them in the presence of the Spirit.

As the Church in Australia participates in the Plenary Council with the second session commencing in July, we look to that same Holy Spirit and trust in the Spirit's guidance. Certainly, while the early Church was facing unexpected growth our circumstances are somewhat different. We also carry both the wisdom and the weight of history and tradition and while that may appear to be a constraint today that same reality had to be considered and dealt with in the Jerusalem decision.

All of us can participate and assist the Plenary Council through our prayers which has never been more important than now. Once again I invite you to go to the website and pray the prayers that are suggested there.

LAUDATO SI' WEEK CONTINUES - Last week's Newsletter highlighted the challenges put forward by Pope Francis in his landmark encyclical *Laudato Si' – Care for our Common Home*. The encyclical begins with the words: "Laudato si', mi Signore" – "Praise be to you, my Lord". These opening words are actually taken from *Canticle of the Creatures* penned by St Francis of Assisi. The canticle continues: "Praise be to you, my Lord, through our Sister, Mother Earth, who sustains us and directs us, bringing forth all kinds of fruits and coloured flowers and herbs." For us as Australians, it is worthwhile reflecting on the interesting relationship between St Francis' words in the canticle and similar 'motherhood' language used by First Nations people in describing their own relationship to country. Ambelin Kwaymullina, a Palyku woman of the East Pilbara in WA, explains it this way: "For Aboriginal peoples, country is much more than a place. Country is loved, needed, and cared for, and country loves, needs, and cares for her peoples in turn. Country is family, culture, identity. Country is self." (Source: Meaning of land to Aboriginal people - Creative Spirits). It is little wonder, therefore, that Pope Francis' words in *Laudato Si'* resonate so deeply with us.
