The Easter Season is a most appropriate time to celebrate the Sacraments of Initiation which are Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist. Just as in the Easter Vigil, all three Sacraments are celebrated by the Elect, so too those children on the more prolonged journey nevertheless enter the real meaning of Easter by celebrating the new life of Christ, which is at the heart of the Sacraments, during the Easter period. Parents and families have commenced the time of more intensive preparation for the celebration of first Holy Communion. We can assist them with our prayers and at all Masses this weekend we have a small ceremony in which we express our prayerful support to these children and their families. It is one of the more fundamental tasks of the Christian community to pass on the Sacraments of the Church. May the Holy Spirit of life help us to do so as best we can.

The topic of the letter, *The Lord's Day*, may seem incongruous with the culture in which we live and the pattern of worship in the Catholic Church in Australia today. Archbishop Mark Coleridge has published a document entitled "LAMPS ABLAZE: Apostolic Priorities for the Archdiocese of Brisbane from 2023", outlining seven priorities for the Archdiocese. From the Second Sunday of Easter until Pentecost, we will introduce each of the seven themes. The fourth priority is:

> Lamps Ablaze: Apostolic Priorities for the Archdiocese of Brisbane

Priority Four: Responding to Abuse and the Abused

"In responding to abuse and the abused, we need to move beyond considerations of law and finance... Of course we need to attend to legal and financial matters, but the paramount concern needs to be the good of those abused. Not all victims and survivors look to the Church for spiritual and pastoral accompaniment and care, but some do and others may in time, if ever trust can be established. We can learn from experience elsewhere in seeking to respond more effectively to abuse and the abused. Unless we do, this will remain a gaping wound – certainly for victims and survivors but for the whole Church as well – which makes it hard for us to move in the future."
