All Saints and All Souls

The month of November begins with two wonderful reminders of our calling to follow Christ. While baptism is the beginning of the Christian life, it is also the gift of a calling to become a saint. For all of us it is a call to go beyond ourselves in love. In the early church all the baptised were referred to as saints.

The opening words of today's second reading are full of confidence: "Think of the love that the Father has lavished on us. We could probably ponder the power of these words more often than we do. They emphasise our dignity since we are children of God and we can look forward to when we will see God face to face. Then we will understand fully what we have only glimpsed in a shadowy way during life. However, we do catch definite hints and suggestions of God's grace and goodness as we carry the cross towards the resurrection because we walk by faith and not by sight.

On All Saints Day we honour the lives of those who continue to inspire us on our journey of faith. Their goodness and love did not end in death but is as powerful today as it was in their time. Among the saints is the official list acknowledged by the Church but the saintly include many of our parents, grandparents and friends who, while their life has ended, their love, example and intercession touches us deeply even now.

All Souls Day reminds of our deep affinity with those who journey to the fullness of life in Christ. The Church, our brothers and sisters in Christ, is a communion of people not defined by nationhood or race or by space and time but by life in the risen Christ. So in prayer we remember and celebrate the lives of those who with us desire life with Christ forever. Core to our faith is that death is not the end since Christ has overcome death so let us pray for those who after death continue on the path to the resurrection.

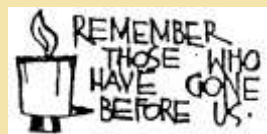

SUPPORT FOR REFUGEE FAMILY - Last Sunday, the
parish’s Social Justice Committee had the privilege of meeting
a young man, Mouemen Dayri who, with his family, is seeking
asylum in Australia. Mouemen, together with his mother and
three other brothers, escaped from the troubled region in
northern Lebanon about 7 years ago when ISIS was at the
pinnacle of its reign of terror and the war in Syria was claiming
the lives of more and more young people. The family managed
to get to Indonesia despite the ruthless exploitation of people
smugglers, but then were taken into custody as their boat
entered Australian waters. The family spent 6 years on Nauru
before being allowed to come to Australia at the end of 2018
under strict community detention regulations.

Community detention meant that while there was assisted
housing, Medicare benefits and a small income provided by the
government department, there were no work or study rights.
Despite this, two of the boys – Mouemen and his brother Wael
(even though they were over the normal school age) – were
welcomed into St James College in Spring Hill early in 2019
and went on to graduate this year, collecting several awards
along the way to everyone’s delight and admiration. The
youngest brother, Yusef (15), currently attends Yeronga State
High School.

Several weeks ago, a letter from the Department of Home
Affairs announced to the family that they were being moved out
of community detention and being put on a Bridging Visa E
(BVE). The BVE allows individuals to stay lawfully in Australia
while they make arrangements to leave, finalise their
immigration papers or wait for an immigration decision on their
future. Being on a BVE means that while there are still some
Medicare benefits and a person has work rights (if they can get
work!), they are stripped of all other government support
including housing and income assistance.

The Dayri family has been fortunate only last week to move into
a small inexpensive unit in Sunnybank on the top floor of a two-
storey house. They also currently receive periodic food
packages from groups such as the Romero Centre. But without
any source of income and after years of being denied work or
study, exacerbated now with the COVID unemployment
situation, Mrs Dayri and her boys are now at high risk of abject
poverty.

Our SUPP project has shown just how generous our parish can
be in supporting those who are victims of our current Australian
Government’s policies. Directly supporting a family here in
Brisbane gives us the opportunity to make our voice heard in
advocating for change in government attitude and policy, as
well as putting into action the Gospel values we hold so dear.
