Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe

Today's Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe certainly has a grand name and makes a bold claim. In essence it names the allembracing consequences of what it means to believe in Christ and follow him. The Feast says more about the meaning of faith than the status of Jesus. Is what I say and do determined by grace because I believe and belong to Christ? Do I look upon others, be they close to me or very different and see, every time, the face of Christ? Do I look upon the beauty of creation and appreciate that everything has been created through the eternal Word (or design) of God? Can I look upon the worst of human suffering and while I want to turn away still believe that life and peace will reign? If that is the case, then Jesus Christ is indeed Lord of all that I do and desire.

Today's solemnity also marks the final Sunday in the liturgical year. Next Sunday, the First Sunday of Advent, means that the cycle of Readings comes from Year B and we will spend many weeks proclaiming and pondering the Gospel of Mark.

This Sunday onwards we will have the readings proclaimed from the New Revised Standard Version of the Bible. This translation is used in many parishes where their Lectionary has fallen to pieces waiting for the Australian Bishops to determine which translation will be proclaimed throughout Australia. The selection and cycle of Readings are the same but I have no doubt you will soon be aware of some subtle differences. It will be very important for Lectors (Readers at Mass) to familiarise themselves with this different translation and prepare accordingly.

Don't forget to mark your diaries for the Wine and Cheese evening next Saturday after Mass and the Carols and Nativity Play on Tuesday the 19th December.
