# Twenty-Eighth Sunday in <mark>Ordinary Time</mark>

Remember that in Matthew's gospel over the past couple of weekends we have been hearing stories that come from the last week of Jesus life. Little wonder that it was his last week alive because Jesus just kept on hammering the Jewish Temple Priests and the Elders, powerful, influential, high status and wealthy leaders of their time and society.

Jesus told them to their face that they were all talk and fine intentions without good deeds and any real desire to do as God wanted; that they were lousy tenants of God's vineyard who wouldn't produce the fruit God required, so they would end up being kicked out from the gift of God and see the vineyard given to others who would produce its fruit. This weekend, doubling down on his criticisms of them, Jesus says that they were like guests invited to the wedding of the King's son, who time after time ignored and mistreated the servants sent to invite them to the feast. Jesus warns them that their town, their way of living and worshipping God, will all end in ruin and that the feast of the King will be opened wide to any who are willing to attend. Listening to these parables we can almost hear these Temple Priests and Elders muttering to themselves, almost feel them seething with rage.

A feast of joy, plenty and eternal life is what God offers, as Isaiah foresaw and told us about in today's 1st reading. St. Paul in his Letter to the Philippians tells us that he has experienced both plenty and poverty and that through our faith God will supply all that we need, in accord with God's glorious riches in Christ. So now it's over to us to hear and accept the invitation to the wedding feast of the Son or to ignore and reject God's offer.

Let's recall that our Eucharist is both the promise of and a foretaste towards this great banquet of life when mourning is banished and all are together as one, cared for and fed by and on Jesus, the Good Shepherd. At a time when we are more divided and conflicted, when lies and fake news seems to rule the roost, and peoples experience violence in horrific ways, choosing to accept the invitation to the feast of God/the King for His Son and living daily in the Spirit, the values and good news of Jesus has rarely ever been more important.

SAFEGUARDING NEWS - The Archdiocese has recently released a revised Volunteers Matrix which no longer includes some "low risk" volunteer roles such as Readers and Special Ministers of Communion at Mass. For those people who are only in these roles, you do not have any safeguarding accreditation requirements. The reason for this is that you are not working or engaging directly with either children or adultsat-risk while in these roles, as the role is publicly during Mass in front of the Priest and the congregation, and therefore in such a way that does not provide an opportunity for abuse.

#### For volunteers who are only in these "low risk" roles:

You may have received an email recently from Blue Card Services that your Blue Card was "de-linked" from the Archdiocese of Brisbane. This action does not necessarily cancel your Blue Card. It just means we no longer require your Blue Card to be registered with the parish (Archdiocese of Brisbane) as your volunteer role/s no longer require a Blue

For volunteers who either engage directly with children or adults-at-risk, or who are in a coordinator/leadership role / handle finances / have keys to the Parish: you will be advised when your safeguarding accreditation requirements are due for renewal.

We continue to renew our Safeguarding Commitment -The Archdiocese has zero tolerance for all forms of abuse and is committed to safeguarding everyone involved in its activities, ministries and services. The safety and wellbeing of children and adults-at-risk is paramount.
