Twenty-Ninth Sunday in <mark>Ordinary</mark> S lime

To appreciate the true depth of this Sunday's Gospel story of the widow and the corrupt judge we must once again realise the cultural differences between Jesus' Palestine and our own experience. Sadly, even today women face extraordinary oppression in parts of the world as we have witnessed only recently. Women were then, and still are, subject to being exploited. In the story Jesus tells, it was demanded by the law that only males could speak for women in court. A woman without a son had little representation. A wealthy person who wanted to swindle her out of her late husband's estate could easily do so with a well-placed bribe.

The situation for this woman in the Gospel was indeed dire and those listening to Jesus knew that the deck was stacked strongly against her. So when Jesus pictured this woman approaching a corrupt judge, his point was not about ordinary persistence but rather resolute perseverance in the face of nearly insurmountable odds. This parable stands in the midst of Jesus' teaching on prayer and reminds us that this attitude in prayer gives us the definitive portrait of faith. Believing despite the fact that your first attempt failed, and your second, and your third shows faith's true character. Faith is not about winning; it is about carrying on the face of apparent failure.

That is what prayer appears to be for Jesus in Luke's account of the Gospel. It is not merely getting what we want but believing that possibilities lie beyond the difficult challenges set before us. It is about believing that God can bring good out of any daunting reality.

**ADVENT -** Sunday 27 November is the start of a new liturgical cycle (Year A) with the commencement of Advent. This is a beautiful and reflective time in the Church Year, with each Sunday liturgy beginning by proclaiming *Maranatha*, an ancient Aramaic work meaning 'come, our Lord.' This hope-filled phrase appears



only once in the New Testament. As he concludes his First Letter to the Corinthians (*1 Cor 16:22*), Paul signs off with the words 'Come, our Lord', a callout to the second coming of Jesus that was a sign of hope and encouragement in the early Church. As we look towards our celebrations of the coming of Christ at Christmas, the parish will be offering a pocket sized book - **Incarnate—Daily Advent and Christmas Reflections 2022** - this has daily reflections from the beginning of Advent to the Baptism of the Lord. Parishioners are invited to order their copy from the Parish Office. Cost of Reflection booklets is \$5.
