# Twenty-Ninth Sunday in O<mark>rdinary Time</mark>

We are familiar with the fact that the Bible, in English, comes to us in various translations. From the very formal King James version to the quite colloquial Good News translation which is very 'easy' in its language. Most of us know the biblical stories from hearing them at Mass which is the Jerusalem Bible translation. This version was published being aware that it would be used in proclamation of the Word of God. For this reason, sections of Paul's letters which can be six to seven lines long in the original are translated into something better able to be spoken.

All language has a cultural context, so translation is a constant task that brings the Word of God into the culture of the day. For many years the English-speaking Bishops of the World have been in discussion regarding a suitable translation of the Word of God to be used in Proclamation. In other words, compiling a new Lectionary for worship. The Jerusalem Bible has some notable 'errors' in translation that can be improved. The books used in Parishes are falling to pieces because no one will publish new ones until the translation is finalised.

In the meantime, the NRSV version which is popular around the English-speaking world is often used. Our parish will join them. We have a new lectionary which is worthy for the purpose of proclamation and to be used in our sacred worship. I encourage you to listen carefully to the familiar stories that may now be expressed slightly different. We will introduce the new Lectionary on the Feast of Christ the King. This will give those who are Readers at Mass time to be informed of resources to help prepare for their ministry.
